1 OPENING

The Speaker requested Council to observe a moment of silence for prayer or meditation.

The Speaker welcomed the Whip of council – Councillor Nkosephayo Zungu, all Political Party Leaders and Whips, Chairpersons of the Section 79 Committees, fellow Councillors, City Manager – Mr Floyd Brink, Secretary to Council – Mr Andile Gobinca, Regional Court President, RCP Modibedi Djadje, officials of the City of Johannesburg, residents of the City of Johannesburg, members of the Media, ladies and gentlemen to the 30th Extra-Ordinary Council meeting of the City of Johannesburg Municipality.

She appreciated everyone's presence and said that the main business of the day was to elect the Executive Mayor. She asked Legal Advisors to confirm the number of Councillors present to confirm quorum which they reported that there were 222 Councillors present therefore there was quorum for the meeting to continue.

Councillor Dammie (ANC) requested a 30-minute caucus break, which the Speaker acceded to.

On resumption, time being 16:15, the Speaker requested Council to observe a moment of silence for the late Councillor M Mphahlele.

3 ELECTIONS OF THE EXECUTIVE MAYOR

In her address, the Speaker acknowledged that the Executive Mayor of the City of Johannesburg Municipal Council had resigned, resulting in a vacancy in the Office of the Executive Mayor. She further stated that the provisions of Section 55 of the Act would apply.

Section 55 (2) states, "Election of Executive Mayors;

- 1. ...*
- 2. A vacancy in the office of the Executive Mayor or Executive Deputy Mayor must be filled when necessary.*
- 3. The procedure set out in Schedule 3 applies to the election of an Executive Mayor and Executive Deputy Mayor"*

She further took Council through Schedule 3:

- In terms of Schedule 3 to the Act, the person Presiding Officer, must call for nominations of candidates for the vacant position of Executive Mayor at this meeting;*
- Each nomination must be submitted on the prescribed form and must be signed by two Councillors, a nominee and a seconder;*
- A person's nomination must indicate acceptance of the nomination by signing the nomination form;*
- Furthermore, Item 4 of Schedule 3 to the Act, requires that the person presiding at this meeting to announce the names of persons who have been nominated as candidates but may not permit a debate.*
- In terms of Item 5 of the Schedule, if only one candidate has been nominated, the person presiding must declare that candidate elected;*

- *If more than one candidate is nominated, and in accordance with Item 6 of the schedule.*
 - (a) *A vote must be taken at the meeting by secret ballot;*
 - (b) *Each Councillor present at the meeting may cast one vote;*
 - (c) *The person presiding must declare the elected candidate who receives the majority of the votes;*

- *In terms of Item 7 of the Schedule; "Elimination Procedure,*
 - (1) *If no candidate receives the majority of the votes, the candidate who receives the lowest number of votes must be eliminated and a further vote taken on the remaining candidates in accordance with Item 6. This procedure must be repeated until a candidate receives the majority of the votes.*

 - (2) *When applying sub item (1), if two or more candidates each have the lowest number of votes, a separate vote must be taken on those candidates and repeated as often as may be necessary to determine which candidate is to be eliminated".*

- *In terms of Item 8, "Further Meetings,*
 - (1) *If only two candidates are nominated, or if only two candidates remain after an elimination procedure has been applied, and those two candidates receive the same number of votes, a further meeting must be held within seven days at a time determined by the person presiding.*
 - (2) *If a further meeting is held in terms of sub item (1), the procedure prescribed in this Schedule must be applied at that meeting as if it were the first meeting for the election in question.*
 - (3) *If at a further meeting held in terms of sub item (1) only two candidates are nominated, or if only two candidates remain after the elimination procedure has been applied, and those two candidates receive the same number of votes, the person presiding at such meeting must determine by lot who of the two candidates will hold the office for which the election has taken place"*

The Speaker informed the Council that the IEC had been requested to oversee the election process and had agreed to do so. She urged Councillors and relevant officials to cooperate with the IEC. The Speaker then announced that the meeting would continue with the election of the Executive Mayor of the City of Johannesburg, in line with Schedule 3 of the Act. She thereafter granted the IEC the opportunity to outline their procedures.

Councillor Christians (DA) sought clarity to ensure that proper process was followed regarding the vacancy of the Executive Mayor. He questioned whether the vacancy arose on the day as said by the Speakers or on the day the Executive Mayor's resignation was announced.

In response, the Speaker clarified that the vacancy began on the day the statement regarding the Executive Mayor's resignation was released.

Councillor Christians thanked the Speaker for the clarification and confirmed that it provided the clarity they sought. He then proposed, due to the political instability in the city, that the DA caucus would like to call for a motion without notice to dissolve the Council and requested the Speaker to schedule a meeting for this debate.

The IEC outlined the voting process for the election of the Executive Mayor.

The Speaker announced that five nominations were received, duly signed and compliant, and such were from Councillor Christians (DA) nominating Councillor Echeozonjoku (DA), seconded by Councillor Rahn (DA); Councillor Mabaso (IFP) nominating Councillor Morero (ANC), seconded by Councillor Makhuba (IFP); Councillor Dammie (ANC) nominating Councillor Morero (ANC), seconded by Councillor Raphadu (ANC); Councillor Kunene (PA) nominating Councillor Morero (ANC), seconded by Councillor Kaldine (Pa); Councillor Magwentshu (ATM) nominating Councillor Morero (ANC), seconded by Councillor Tshwaku (EFF); Councillor Mhlongo (AIC) nominating Councillor Morero (ANC), seconded by Councillor Nkokou (PAC).

Councillors Christians (DA) and Rahn (DA) accordingly read out the nomination form, proposing and seconding the nomination of Councillor Echeozonjoku BC (DA) for the position of the Executive Mayor of the City of Johannesburg Municipality.

Councillor Echeozonjoku read out the nomination form, accepting the nomination for the position of the Executive Mayor of the City of Johannesburg Municipality.

Councillors Mabaso (IFP) and Makhuba (IFP) accordingly read out the nomination form, proposing and seconding the nomination of Councillor Morero (ANC) for the position of the Executive Mayor of the City of Johannesburg Municipality.

Councillor Morero read out the nomination form, accepting the nomination for the position of the Executive Mayor of the City of Johannesburg Municipality.

Voting commenced, and the results were as follows:

- *Total votes cast: 253*
- *Spoilt votes: 4*
- *Valid votes: 249*
- *Cancelled ballot: 1*
- *Councillor Echeozonjoku, B: 60 votes*
- *Councillor Morero, SE: 189 votes*

All party agents signed the results slip.

The Speaker then declared Councillor Sello Enock Morero duly elected as the Executive Mayor of the City of Johannesburg Municipality and extended congratulations to the newly elected Executive Mayor.

3.1 SWEARING-IN OF THE EXECUTIVE MAYOR

The Speaker then handed over the Regional Court President, RCP Modibedi Djadje to administer the swearing in of the newly elected Executive Mayor, Councillor Enock Morero.

3.2 ACCEPTANCE SPEECH BY THE NEWLY ELECTED EXECUTIVE MAYOR

The Executive Mayor addressed Council as follows:

“Greetings to Madam Speaker and our Whip of Council. Greetings to Minister Parks Tau. Greetings to the Premier Panyaza Lesufi and Members of his Cabinet. Let me take this opportunity to acknowledge and appreciate the beautiful contest we have had with the most beautiful lady amongst us ourselves in the Chamber, Councillor Belinda Echeozonjoku, we had a very beautiful contest, and thank you very much.

To the people of South Africa,

As guided by our Constitution, Act 108 of 1996, let us remember that:

We are the people of South Africa.

We must continuously recognize the injustice of our past.

We must honour those who suffered for justice and freedom in our land. We must respect those who have worked to build and develop our country. We must believe that South Africa belongs to all who live in it.

We are united in our diversity.

To the residents of Johannesburg.

We must remember that we are winners.

We are winners because many people want to live in our city.

We are winners because we love Johannesburg. It is the place we call home. It is our first love, Councillor Marumo.

FELLOW COUNCILLORS

Let us pause and reset. Reset does not mean; we start from scratch. It means we acknowledge our mistakes, and we must apologise where we have failed the people of Johannesburg. It also means that we must celebrate our good story and indeed, we do have a good story to tell.

The people of Johannesburg tasked us with basic duties of making sure that:

- 1. Water comes out of their taps.*
- 2. Lights come on.*
- 3. Waste is collected.*
- 4. Robots/traffic lights work.*
- 5. Buses operate efficiently.*
- 6. People live in safe communities.*

This is not too much to ask for. The people of Johannesburg are depending on us for a better future. We have all gone through pain and sorrow, but we are wiser and stronger now. We must help the City to move beyond its complex challenges and find simple solutions that remind the people of Johannesburg, why Johannesburg we will always remain our first love.

Madam Speaker

Please allow me to talk about the 2024 moment. This is a significant moment for all South Africans. It is the moment, where all South Africans interfaced with our democratic political system. This interaction resulted in a strong message that symbolized destruction and unity. This signal changed our political landscape. Today marks the realignment of the Government of Local Unity (GLU). We cannot ignore election outcomes. We are public servants, and we must listen to the voice or the silence of the people we serve. Sun Tzu in the Art of War presents us with his warrior philosophy that states: "Generals are assistants of the nation. When their assistance is complete, the country is strong. When their assistance is defective, the country is weak." Like generals, politicians are assistance of the nation. Our conduct determines the strength of the nation.

The 2024 moment calls for a reset Johannesburg is the heartbeat of South Africa. To keep South Africa alive, we must implement the District Development Model (DDM). Alone we will not solve problems affecting Johannesburg. We call upon the Gauteng Provincial Government, to help us to implement our service delivery programme that change lives. We call upon National Government, to effectively utilize Section 154 of Constitution. Policy planning coordination is critical to the success of Johannesburg. The National Department of Corporative Governance supported by the South African Local Government Association (SALGA) shaped our private sector framework. This relationship is assisting us to address our technical challenges. We must accelerate implementation.

Business and civil society are central to our developmental agenda. Without them economic growth will not happen in Johannesburg. Growing the economy of Johannesburg must happen within the context of the District Development Model. As a minimum programme, for all of us, we must use the 2024/25 financial year to stabilise local government. By doing this, our economy will grow faster, young people will be in jobs, basic services will be enjoyed by all, and transformation will happen at a faster pace.

Madam Speaker

Please allow me to repeat: "The 2024 moment requires us to listen." We are the sphere of government that is the closest to the people. We must plan with our communities. This Constitutional responsibility requires all of us to move together. Our leadership change since 2016, has been disruptive and we cannot continue on this disruptive path. Cities are meant to be developmental, resilient, and sustainable because they shape the form of societies.

To members of the Media

We do not talk enough about the formation of Johannesburg. When Johannesburg was formed, the apartheid government deliberately built a spatial design that was not inclusive. When democratic local government happened in Johannesburg, we tried to break this pattern. Our land space is amongst the smallest in South Africa, and our

population is the biggest and it will continue to grow. We must rise above our day-to-day challenges, so that we can reimagine a Johannesburg that is inclusive, colourful, and full of love.

Joburg 2040 was supported by all, including political parties. Therefore, our path remains. We must continue to make Johannesburg a World Class African City of the Future. Our city must remain vibrant, equitable and it must be strengthened through its diversity.

Fellow residents of Johannesburg

I think it is ok to continue where we left off. Collectively:

1. *We started implementing our energy sustainability strategy that tried to ensure the delivery of conventional power and integrate new distributed energy. We believe that these positive steps will continue to be supported and give the city the ability to generate energy.*
2. *We agreed to keep the city clean. This meant making the city functional by keeping the lights on, improving uninterrupted mobility, and protecting the environment by implementing programmes that focus on:*
 - *Litter picking – public spaces*
 - *Clearing illegal dumping*
 - *Grass-cutting programme*
 - *Recycling programme*
 - *Reeds and wetland maintenance*
 - *Pollution prevention*
