## 1 OPENING

*The Speaker requested Council to observe a moment of silence for prayer and meditation.*

*She proceeded to open the meeting and extended a warm welcome to the Executive Mayor of the City of Johannesburg, Councillor Kabelo Gwamanda, Whip of Council, Councillor N Zungu, the Chair of Chairs, Councillor L. Phillips (in absentia), all Political Party Leaders and Whips, Members of the Mayoral Committee, Chairpersons of the Section 79 Committees, fellow Councillors, City Manager Mr. Floyd Brink, Acting Secretary to Council Mr. Andile Gobinca, officials of the City of Johannesburg, residents, members of the media, and all attendees present to the 19<sup>th</sup> Ordinary Council meeting of the City of Johannesburg Municipality.*

*She indicated that on Thursday, March 21st, the country will be celebrating Human Rights Day. She emphasized that this day serves as a reminder to all South Africans of the sacrifices made during the struggle for the attainment of democracy. She highlighted the importance of using Human Rights Day and the entire month to actively promote, restore, and uphold human dignity.*

*The Speaker said that she had received a request from Councillor Davids-Green (ActionSA) regarding a matter of urgent public importance relating to the water crisis. The request complied with the Standing Rules and Orders of the Council. She announced that the debate would take place during the Council meeting scheduled for the next day, 20 March 2024, because the relevant Member of the Mayoral Committee (MMC) was not present at the meeting, he had tendered an apology.*

*She requested the Legal Advisors to confirm the number of Councillors present to ensure that the meeting had the necessary quorum to proceed. She reported that there were 140 Councillors present, confirming that quorum was met, and thus, the meeting could proceed.*

*Councillor Lebatlang (ActionSA) requested a 20-minute caucus break, which the Speaker granted. The Speaker asked the ActionSA caucus to reconvene at 10:25.*

*On resumption, the Speaker announced that there were 182 Councillors present in the House.*

*She stated that she received a request from both the Executive and the Legislature to elevate items 54 through 80, as well as items 82 and 84 after the Annual Report is dealt with.*

*Councillor Knott (DA) requested that item 82 precede item 54. She stated that they would speak on item 41 in its entirety but requested that all four policies be read into the record separately, and their recommendations be approved separately as well. Furthermore, she emphasized the importance of presenting policies separately in the future, rather than as a group.*

#### 3.1 Statement by the Executive Mayor

*The Executive Mayor greeted and acknowledged the Madam Speaker of Council, the Whip of Council, Councillor N Zungu; Chair of Chairs, Councillor L Phillips in absentia; the Head of Administration, Mr Floyd Brink; the MMCs; the leaders of political parties and political parties represented in the Council; guests in the gallery; and the residents who are streaming live from the social media channels.*

*He thereafter addressed Council as follows:*

*“Madam Speaker. I think it is becoming consistent that the City of Johannesburg is facing a number of challenges especially due to natural occurrences. I would like to share some information with Councillors for information purposes. Last night at around 20:45 (18 March 2024), we experienced a lightning strike at the Eldorado substation which subsequently feeds the Orlando substation and Eikenhof. Which then means a few supply systems have been affected by this occurrence and I would like to urge our residents to bear with the City of Johannesburg. I was in Orlando where the lightning had struck to assist and try to escalate the matter so that it is attended to speedily. Before I left power was restored but as you would know, water unlike electricity would take time for our reservoirs to build up. Madam Speaker, I would like to note the 8 systems that have been affected due to last night’s occurrence: Vaal Deval Tower, Linden 1 Tower, Orlando East Reservoir, Honeydew Reservoir and Tower, Brixton Reservoir, Hursthill 1 and the Hursthill 2.*

*As indicated City Power had attended to the matter, and power was restored. Madam Speaker, I have had consistent meetings with Rand Water and the Minister of Water and Sanitation. It seems we would have to up our infrastructure investment, especially in energy supply because it is not as a direct result of our water infrastructure that we are experiencing these challenges but due to natural occurrences that we have no control over. There is a program in place, we are waiting for Rand Water to give us the go-ahead. As the City of Johannesburg, we are building an alternative Power Station that is going to feed Eikenhoff so that we can completely insulate it from such occurrences and have an automatic alternative that will come into action whenever we experience disruption of this nature.*

*Thank you very much, Madam Speaker, for the indulgence. I hope the residents in the City of Johannesburg bear with us. We will attend to this issue speedily and ensure that water is restored across the City. Thank you very much”.*

#### **4 CONFIRMATION OF MINUTES**

(18<sup>th</sup> Ordinary Meeting held on 29 February 2024)

*On Page 16, Point 4, of the confirmation of minutes, Councillor P. Smit’s political party must be corrected from ACDP to VF+.*

*On Page 16, under “Resolved”, of the confirmation of minutes, the resolution must read: “That the minutes of the 17th Ordinary meeting held on 31 January 2024 be taken as read and confirmed” and not “That the minutes of the 17th Ordinary Meeting held on 31 September 2023 be taken as read and confirmed.”*

(25<sup>th</sup> Extra-Ordinary Meeting held on 8 March 2024)

*Councillor Pelzer, R (VF+), should be removed from the list of members present and recorded under leave of absence.*

*Councillor Christians (DA) thanked the Speaker for including Rule 84 of the Standing Rules and Orders of Council in all the minutes and said that the Democratic Alliance moves for the adoption of the minutes as amended.*

*Councillor Rafferty (PA) seconded the adoption of the minutes.*

## RESOLVED

That the minutes of the 18<sup>th</sup> Ordinary Meeting held on 29 February 2024 and the 25<sup>th</sup> Extra-Ordinary Meeting held on 8 March 2024 as amended be taken as read and confirmed.

*Councillor Mthembu (ActionSA) reminded the Speaker that she is not the Speaker for the Government of Local Unity only, but the Speaker of all 270 Councillors. She said that the Speaker must start acting like the Speaker of the Council and that there is only one Speaker. Therefore, the rest of the Councillors who were interrupting must keep quiet and not be disruptive, saying "thulani, ningazo phapha".*

*The Speaker asked Councillor Mthembu which item she was speaking about and requested that her to be seated. She stated that she would not allow the Council to descend into a situation where Councillor Mthembu was uncontrollable. She further asserted that she has never been a one-sided Speaker and has always addressed issues impartially. She indicated that Councillor Mthembu was being disruptive.*

*Councillor Raphadu rose on the point of order and requested that Councillor Mthembu withdraws that Councillors "baya phapha." She further stated that she must be referred to the Ethics and Disciplinary Committee if she does not withdraw.*

*Councillor Echeozonjoku (DA) thanked the Speaker for trying to control the House. She mentioned that Council had convened for almost an hour, and the meeting had not started yet. She reminded everyone that residents elected them to do the work of Council but people were without water. She said that the Speaker could use the necessary power invested in her. She further stated that the Speaker knows what to do if people do not want to attend the meeting..*

*MMC Makhafola (EFF) concurred with Councillor Raphadu, stating that Councillor Mthembu can never say "siya phapha la." She emphasized that they are not children but adults and Councillor Mthembu must speak to Councillors with respect. She also requested that Councillor Mthembu withdraw the word "ni ya phapha."*

*Councillor De Lange (VF+) stated that if a Councillor did not submit their name to be on the Speaker's list, they could do so after the item is read.*

*The Speaker concurred with Councillor De Lange, stating that this is the procedure they have allowed to follow and that ActionSA did not want to submit a name for the speaker but intended to do something else. She mentioned that she had suppressed Councillor Christians from speaking and that ActionSA wanted to speak on behalf of Councillor Christians. She emphasized that she was not going to allow the Council to deteriorate and further stated that she would not allow Councillors to talk if they spoke on the tabled item . She requested Councillor Mthembu to withdraw "uyaphapha" because there were no children present. She expressed her surprise at*

*ActionSA's actions, especially after they had informed her that there would be disruption, without specifying that they themselves would be the ones causing the disruption. She added that there were water challenges that the ward Councillors needed to address.*

*Councillor Mthembu (ActionSA) said that she was glad the Speaker was addressing the water issue, as there were residents outside who wanted to be addressed by Council due to their lack of access to water. She stated that the MMC of Environment and Infrastructure Services (EISD) had been making promises regarding this matter.*

*The Speaker requested Councillor Mthembu to be seated as she was taking a point of order from the Whip of Council.*

*The Whip of Council appealed to the whip of ActionSA, expressing concern that at the current pace, Council would not be able to conclude its business for the day. He asked the whip of ActionSA to control his caucus.*

*The Speaker asked Councillor Mthembu to withdraw her remarks and be seated so the business of Council could continue.*

*Councillor Mthembu (ActionSA) reiterated that residents outside needed attention.*

*MMC Masuku emphasized that the Speaker had made a ruling and ActionSA had chosen to ignore it. She stated that if Councillors did not obey the Speaker's rulings, she had the power to invoke the Standing Rules and Orders of Council. She further asserted that if Councillors did not wish to serve the residents of Johannesburg through Council, they should leave.*

*The Speaker stated that Councillor Mthembu did not seem willing to withdraw her remarks, and she was going to take the action suggested by Councillor Echeozonjoku and MMC Masuku, which was to exercise her powers as the Speaker of Council. She indicated that if Councillors did not wish to attend the meeting, they must excuse themselves.*

*Councillor Raphadu (ANC) cited Rule 30(8) of the Standing Rules and Orders of Council, emphasizing that Councillors violated the rules by engaging in disruptive behaviour. He proposed that Councillors who were not adhering to the rules should leave the House, and if they refused, they should be referred to the Ethics and Disciplinary Committee.*

*Councillor Echeozonjoku (DA) said that they were comforted that the previous Speaker of Council had left and were promised that the current Speaker would handle proceedings properly. She highlighted that people were watching the Council proceedings live and suggested that the Whip of Council meet with the whips of other political parties in hopes of bringing about order.*

*The Speaker referred to Rule 77(1) of the Standing Rules and Orders of Council, reading it as follows:*

*"Councillor ordered to withdraw.*

*77 (1) The Councillor presiding over the Council or chairing a committee meeting may order a Councillor to withdraw immediately from a meeting for the remainder of that meeting."*

*She then asked Councillor Mthembu to withdraw from Council as the Council wanted to proceed with the business of the day, and she was not willing to withdraw her remarks. She stated that the entire ActionSA caucus would be referred to the Ethics and Disciplinary Committee. She ordered Councillor Mthembu to leave the House.*

*Councillor Marema (ANC) referred to a quote stating that "You cannot wrestle with a pig in the mud and expect it to come out clean." He said that the Speaker was playing into the hands of those who did not want the meeting to proceed. He further said that when the ActionSA caucus requested a break in the morning, it was not truly about water challenges. He mentioned that the Executive Mayor had explained earlier that a natural cause in the morning led to reservoirs disruptions affecting water access. He understood that it was election time and suggested that some political parties were trying to appear as if they were fighting for the people, especially since the meeting was online. He stated that this behavior was unacceptable and emphasized the need to proceed with the meeting.*

*Councillor Mphahlele (EFF) stated that Councillor Mthembu should be referred to the Ethics and Disciplinary Committee. He pointed out that the Speaker had asked Councillor Mthembu to withdraw her remarks, and refused to do so. He emphasized that the Speaker should refrain from acting emotionally but follow the procedure, as otherwise, the Council might collapse, for which the blame would fall on the Speaker. He also mentioned that the issue of water was a valid point, addressed by the Executive Mayor, who explained that there was a natural cause.*

*Councillor Christians (DA) stated that the Speaker had started very well, but now she was allowing a debate. He said that after making a ruling in terms of Rule 72(a) of the Standing Rules and Orders of Council, the Speaker was not supposed to permit other speakers to participate in a debate. He pointed out that the Speaker had ruled in terms of Rule 71(1) of the Standing Rules and Orders of Council, and according to Rule 71(2), the Speaker should enforce the removal of the Councillor. If Councillor Mthembu refuses to leave the Chamber, she must be referred to the Ethics and Disciplinary Committee. He also suggested that she must write to the Rules Committee if she wishes to appeal.*

*The Speaker read out the Regulations of the Code of Councillors as follows:*

*'If the Councillor fails to obey the order or the request, a law enforcement official employed by the municipality will then remove the Councillor from the meeting.'*

*After that, she stated that she would request the Johannesburg Metro Police to remove the Councillor from the meeting. The Speaker asked Protocol to remove the Councillor.*

*The Whip of Council requested a 5-minute caucus with the whips of all political parties represented in the House. Upon resumption, the Whip of Council stated that Councillor Mthembu had to leave the House as per the Speaker's ruling and her whip has been notified. He further mentioned that the ActionSA caucus feels the Speaker is treating them unfairly for not acknowledging them when they raise their hands.*

*Councillor Lebatlang (ActionSA) emphasized that the Council needed to address service delivery issues and stressed the importance of allowing the business of Council to proceed. However, he expressed concern that the caucus of 44 Councillors voted in by the residents of Johannesburg was not being recognized. He pointed out that their attempts to raise points of order and seek clarity on Council proceedings were being ignored.*

*The Speaker asked Councillor Lebatlang whether he agreed with the report provided by the Whip of Council or if he disagreed.*

*In his response, Councillor Lebatlang stated that, as the ActionSA caucus, they disagreed with the notion that Councillor Mthembu must leave the House. He explained that Councillor Mthembu had not refused to withdraw her remarks. She was raising legitimate service delivery issues.*

*The Speaker reiterated that the Executive Mayor had addressed the issue of water. She then requested a lady from Protocol to remove Councillor Mthembu from the House.*

*All members of the ActionSA caucus left the meeting.*

*Councillor Raphadu (ANC) raised a concern that Councillor Lebatlang made a hand gesture at the Speaker while she was still addressing him, which he found disrespectful. He requested that Councillor Lebatlang be referred to the Ethics and Disciplinary Committee.*

*The Speaker referred to the Code of Conduct for Councillors, stating that a walkout is an act of leaving a meeting or failing to remain in attendance without the chairperson's permission when a vote is taken on any matter or before the chairperson adjourns the meeting. She said that the ActionSA Councillors who walked out would be dealt with accordingly.*

*She then wished the Muslim Councillors well for Ramadan, saying she was with them in spirit and asking Allah to be with them.*

*After the ActionSA caucus left the Council meeting, the Speaker asked the Legal Advisors to determine a quorum.*

*It was reported that 197 Councillors were present in the House; therefore, a quorum was met.*

RATES TARIFFS FOR TABLING 2024/2025

NOTED

- 1 That in terms of Sections 2, 7, 8 and 14 of the Local Government : Municipal Property Rates Act 6 of 2004 ("the Act"), read with Sections 4(1)(c)(ii) and 11(3)(i) of the Local Government : Municipal Systems Act 32 of 2000 ("the Systems Act") and Section 24(2)(c)(i) of the Local Government : Municipal Financial Management Act 56 of 2003 ("the MFMA"), The Council of the City of Johannesburg Metropolitan Municipality hereby declares its intention that the following draft rates in the Rand are to be levied for the financial year 1 July 2024 to 30 June 2025, on the market value of property or the market value of a right in land within the area of jurisdiction of the Council as appearing in the valuation roll, in respect of the various categories of properties set out below, refer to (4):
- 2 That the rates levied in terms of Paragraph 1 above shall become due and payable in twelve equal instalments on fixed days for twelve consecutive months, these being the due date stipulated in the account sent to the ratepayer.
- 3 That in terms of Section D Paragraph 3(c) of the Council's Property Rates Policy, interest is charged on rates not paid on or before the fixed days, at the rate determined by the Council from time to time.
- 4 That the following proposed rates tariffs be levied for the financial year 2024/2025 to any owner of ratable property as indicated in the table below:

\*1 Multipurpose properties will be rated according to the multiple purposes as defined in the Act. *This can be defined as properties that have multiple categories; however, all the categories will be billed on the same stand and account.* The tariff to be charged will follow the split that will be allocated to a property in the General Valuation roll.

- 5 That the City of Johannesburg may, in terms of the criteria set out in the Rates Policy, exempt a specific category of owners of properties or owners of a specific category of property from the payment of rates levied on their property: or grant to a specific category of owners of properties, or the owners of a specific category of properties, a rebate on or a reduction in the rates payable in respect of their properties, as determined in this policy.

All exemption, reductions and rebates must be done on a prescribed application form and a reference number must be attached to the application form. In terms of Section 15(1)(b) of the Act, read with Section B of the Property Rates Policy, Council grants exemptions, reductions and rebates as stipulated below:

(1) Residential property:

- (a) That the first R300 000 of the value of all residential property shall be exempt from rating.

- (b) Residential property owned and occupied by natural persons who have limited income and who are not pensioners, and the value of their property does not exceed R500 000, but can show that his or her annual income falls below the limit determined by Council from time to time in terms of the Expanded Social Package rebate dependent on points rating.
  - (c) Residential property owned and occupied by pensioners aged 60-69 whose income does not exceed the maximum of R12 475 per month over the previous income tax year, 100% rebate up to the market value up to R 1.5 million. Rates will be levied on the property market value in excess of R1.5 million.
  - (d) Residential property owned and occupied by pensioners aged 60-69 whose income exceed R12 475 but does not exceed R21 383 per month over the previous income tax year, 50% rebate up to the market value up to R 1.5 million. Rates will be levied on the property market value in excess of R1.5 million.
  - (e) Residential property owned and occupied by pensioners aged 70 and above, qualifies for 100% rebate up to the market value of R2 million. Rates will be levied on the property market value in excess of R2 million.
  - (f) Residential property owners who are on a government grant due to a disability whose gross monthly household income is lower than R12 475 with a property value not exceeding to R 1.5 million, qualifies for a 100% rates rebate.
  - (g) Residential properties meeting the requirements for high density as set out by the City can apply for high density rebate and will qualify for a rebate of 5% on the monthly charge for rates.
  - (h) Residential property which is occupied by a minor whose parents have died while they were owners of the property: 100% rebate. The market value should not exceed R1.5 million.
- (2) That property declared as heritage sites in terms of Section 27, 28 and 31 of the National Heritage Resources Act 25 of 1999 will qualify for 20% rebate.
  - (3) That property owned by private sports clubs that are used primarily for sports purposes will qualify for 40% rebate.
  - (4) That property registered in the name of an institution or organisation which has, as its exclusive objective the protection of animals will qualify for 100% rebate.

- (5) Those properties that are vacant but may not be developed as a direct result of the inability of Council to provide services, subject to the owner providing written confirmation from the service entity stating that no development can be allowed for the duration of the ensuing financial year, because of lack of services will be granted 50% rebate of the vacant land tariff.
- (6) Those properties owned by organisations that are registered in terms of the Housing Development Schemes for Retired Persons Act: 50%. (1) Property owned by pensioners in terms of the Housing development Scheme for Retired Persons who are sectionalized and registered in their name would be treated as per Paragraph 8 (i) - (iii).
- (7) Properties owned by individuals or entities designated as Registered Social Landlords qualifies for a 40% rebate. The property must comply with the conditions contained in the Social Housing Act (No.16 of 2008).
- (8) Those properties developed within the identified Corridors of Freedom qualifies for the following rebates:
  - (a) During construction, a rebate of 75% of the rate as per the category of land for a period not exceeding two years during construction, and
  - (b) Post construction, a rebate of 50% of the rates payable as per the category assigned in the General Valuation Roll for a period not exceeding one year.
- (9) Township industrial properties developed within the identified townships qualifies for the following:
  - (a) During construction rebate 75% of the rate as per the category of land for a period not exceeding two years during construction, and
  - (b) Post construction, the industrial property owner qualifies for 50% of the rates payable as per the category assigned in the General Valuation Roll for a period not exceeding two years.  
The above rebate also applies to refurbishment of township industrial properties.
- (10) Public and Independent Schools:
  - (a) Public schools under the category Public Service Purpose.  
The property rates will be phased in over a four-year period.  
The rates payable/levied will be:  
Year 1 - 25% of the tariff for this category (2023/2024)  
Year 2 - 50% of the tariff for this category (2024/2025)  
Year 3 - 75% of the tariff for this category (2025/2026)  
Year 4 - 100% of the tariff for this category (2026 and beyond)

- (b) Independent schools under the category Public Service Purpose.  
The property rates will be phased in over a four-year period.  
The rates payable/levied will be:  
Year 1 - 25% of the tariff for this category (2023/2024)  
Year 2 - 50% of the tariff for this category (2024/2025)  
Year 3 - 75% of the tariff for this category (2025/2026)  
Year 4 - 100% of the tariff for this category (2026 and beyond)
- 6 That in terms of Section 14 of the MPRA read with Sections 17(3)(a)(ii) and 22(a)(i) and (ii) of the Local Government: Municipal Finance Management Act, 2003 (Act 56 of 2003) and Sections 21, 21A(1) and (2) of the Local Government : Municipal Systems Act, 2000 (Act 32 of 2000) as amended, the City of Johannesburg is required to:
- (1) Display the notice and the documents in the manner prescribed.
  - (2) Convey to the local community by means of radio broadcasts covering the area of the City, the information contemplated in Section 21A(c) of the Local Government: Municipal Systems Act, 2000 (Act 32 of 2000) as amended.
- 7 That in terms of Section 22(b)(i) and (ii) of the Local Government: Municipal Finance Management Act, 2003 (Act 56 of 2003) a copy of the notice and documents be sent forthwith to the National and Provincial Treasury; MEC for Local Government and Housing; as well any other organ of state or municipality affected by the budget to solicit their view.

## 1 OPENING

*The Speaker requested Council to observe a moment of silence.*

*She proceeded to open the meeting and extended a warm welcome to the Executive Mayor of the City of Johannesburg, Councillor Kabelo Gwamanda, Whip of Council, Councillor N Zungu, the Chair of Chairs, Councillor L. Phillips (in absentia), all Political Party Leaders and Whips, Members of the Mayoral Committee, Chairpersons of the Section 79 Committees, fellow Councillors, City Manager Mr. Floyd Brink, Acting Secretary to Council Mr. Andile Gobinca, officials of the City of Johannesburg, residents, members of the media, and all attendees present at the continuation of the 19<sup>th</sup> Ordinary Council Meeting of the City of Johannesburg Municipality.*

*The Speaker requested the Legal Advisors to confirm the number of Councillors present to ensure a quorum for the meeting to proceed.*

*The Legal Advisors reported that 150 Councillors were present, confirming that quorum was met, and the meeting could proceed.*

*The Speaker mentioned that Councillors are sent a notice and messages that cover various logistical details when a Council meeting is convened. These communications specify the meal arrangements for the day, indicating whether breakfast or lunch will be served. Additionally, they address issues related to security and parking, ensuring that all relevant information is provided to the Councillors.*

*The Speaker raised a concern brought forth by Councillor Affairs regarding the behavior of some Councillors towards security personnel over parking arrangements. She noted that Councillors had spoken very harshly and threatened the security staff. Despite arrangements being made for Councillors to park at the SAPPI building and this information being communicated to all Councillors, the security personnel were feeling pressured and considered withdrawing their services.*

*The Speaker emphasized that if the security personnel withdraw and any harm comes to the Councillors as a result, she will be held liable. She urged Councillors to maintain discipline and adhere to the established rules. Additionally, she invited any Councillor dissatisfied with the rules to bring their concerns directly to her.*
