The Speaker welcomed all present at the meeting and requested everyone to observe a moment of silence for prayer or meditation.

The Speaker welcomed Executive Mayor of the City of Johannesburg, Councillor S Morero; Whip of Council, Councillor N Zungu; Chair of Chairs, Councillor V Marema; all political party leaders and whips; Members of the Mayoral Committee; Chairpersons of the Section 79 Committees; fellow Councillors; Acting City Manager, Mr T Makola; Secretary to Council, Mr A Gobinca; officials and residents of the City of Johannesburg; members of the Media; ladies and gentlemen, to the 31st Ordinary Council meeting of the City of Johannesburg municipality.

She thereafter notified Council that an urgent motion had been received from Councillor N. Jonker (DA), which was stated to be in line with Rule 34(2). The Speaker added that Legal had advised that no such Rule 34(2) exists in the Standing Rules and Orders of Council.

The Speaker allowed 5 minutes for Legal to verify the number of Councillors present to confirm the quorum. Legal confirmed that 231 Councillors were present; therefore, the meeting could continue as a quorum was constituted.

The Speaker asked Council to join her in wishing all Councillors who celebrated their birthdays during April, May, and June well, and extended her best wishes to them.

3.1 Statement by the Executive Mayor

The Executive Mayor addressed Council as follows:

“Speaker of Council, Councillor Nobuhle Mthembu, Chief Whip of Council, Councillor Sithembiso Zungu, Members of the Mayoral Committee, honourable Councillors, City Manager and the administration team, fellow South Africans, guests in the gallery, ladies and gentlemen, comrades and compatriots, Dumelang!

We are here to do Council work. The people of Johannesburg have put us here to implement their wishes. They trusted us with their vote. A vote in South Africa is a special choice of action that forms part of our democratic process. We are the byproduct of this democratic South Africa.

Madam Speaker, what is democracy? Last night I came across our Parliament’s definition of democracy, which reminds us that the word 'democracy' comes from the Greek word demokratia, which means 'government by the people'. It further unpacks this word by stating the following:

"Democracy is a balance between 'might' and 'right'. The state takes all the power (it has all the 'might'), but its power must be limited so that it does not abuse this power (to make sure it does 'right'). The Constitution guarantees the independence of the courts and establishes six independent institutions to protect citizens: the Public Protector, the Human Rights Commission, the Commission for the Promotion and Protection of the Rights of Cultural, Religious and Linguistic Minorities, the Commission for Gender Equality, the Auditor General and the Independent Electoral Commission.

Democracy is about balancing rights and responsibilities. Citizens can expect the government to do things for them, like providing protection, health services, education and housing. Citizens also have responsibilities like obeying the law and paying taxes to the state.

Democracy is about balancing the rights of the majority with protection for minorities. Democracy is about achieving a greater balance in society so that there is greater equality for all over a period of time."

Fellow Councillors, we should have no fear. Like I said, we are here today because of a democratic process. Not because of this motion of no confidence that aimed to destabilize the City of Johannesburg.

70 years ago, the People of South Africa declared that:

"South Africa belongs to all who live in it, black and white, and that no government can justly claim authority unless it is based on the will of all the people; that our people have been robbed of their birthright to land, liberty and peace by a form of government founded on injustice and inequality; that our country will never be prosperous or free until all our people live in brotherhood, enjoying equal rights and opportunities; that only a democratic state, based on the will of all the people, can

secure to all their birthright without distinction of colour, race, sex or belief; And therefore, we, the people of South Africa, black and white together - equals, countrymen and brothers - adopt this, Freedom Charter. And we pledge ourselves to strive together, sparing neither strength nor courage, until the democratic changes here set out have been won."

Madam Speaker, this will be achieved by ensuring the following:

- 1. The people shall govern!*
- 2. All national groups shall have equal rights!*
- 3. The people shall share in the country's wealth!*
- 4. The land shall be shared among those who work it!*
- 5. All shall be equal before the law!*
- 6. All shall enjoy equal human rights!*
- 7. There shall be work and security!*
- 8. The doors of learning and of culture shall be opened!*
- 9. There shall be houses, security and comfort!*
- 10. There shall be peace and friendship!*

All of the above are being implemented by the longest liberation organization that has put us here to serve the people of Johannesburg.

As we exercise our duties, let us remember our 10 fun facts that make us Johannesburg, the people of Jozi, Jozi Maboneng.

- 1. We are serving and creating a home, not a house, for 5.8 million people.*
- 2. We are the biggest metro by population size in South Africa. Johannesburg's population constitutes about 37% of the Gauteng population and 9% of South Africa's overall population.*
- 3. Most people who come to Johannesburg move to the city from other parts of Gauteng (55%). 33% are born in South Africa but in another province, and 13% are from another country.*
- 4. Johannesburg is the economic hub of the country.*
- 5. Johannesburg's economic dominance is projected to continue, with its GDP reaching an estimated R784 billion by 2028. This represents 44.8% of the province's total GDP, maintaining Johannesburg's position as the leading regional economy.*
- 6. The city's robust growth, averaging 2.26% annually between 2023 and 2028, surpasses that of the other regional economies.*
- 7. The finance sector is the largest, accounting for R 325 billion or 34.7% of the total Gross Value Added (GVA) in the city. The sector that contributes the second most to the GVA of Johannesburg is the community services sector at 18.6%, followed by the manufacturing sector with 16.3%. The sector that contributes the least to the economy is the agriculture sector with a contribution of R 3.2 billion or 0.34% of the total GVA.*
- 8. Johannesburg's Gini-coefficient has reduced since 2013. However, it is still high in comparison to other metropolitan cities in the world. In 2023, the Gini coefficient in the City of Joburg was 0.59, an improvement from 0.64 in 2013.*

9. *Johannesburg's Human Development Index (HDI), comprising of a long and healthy life, knowledge, and a decent standard of living is 0.713, which is slightly higher than the HDI of South Africa (0.662).*
10. *The city has made strides in improving the health status of its residents by focusing primarily on early preventative interventions. Compared to 10 years ago, people in the city are now living longer and healthier lives. This is evident in the life expectancy at birth data, which increased from 62 years in 2010 to 67 years in 2022.*

The decisions we make today will define who we are. As this Council, our good story remains. It should be echoed in all corridors of power. We should be pleased that we have managed to ensure that:

- *81.8% of residents live in formal dwellings. Which means, 1.8 million households of the city live in formal dwellings.*
- *99.3% have access to water. This means 2.2 million (99.3%) households in the city have access to water serviced through water piped (tap) inside or yard connection in formalised areas and through communal standpipes within a maximum walking distance of 200 metres in informal settlements.*
- *89.5 % have access to electricity. Which means, 2 million households in the City of Johannesburg use electricity for lighting and of those, 1.8 million households (78.4%) have access to electricity from a public supplier.*
- *94.6% have access to sanitation. Which means, 2.1 million households in the City of Johannesburg have access to sanitation through individual sewer connections to properties.*
- *85.7% receive refuse removal services. Which means, 1.9 million households across Johannesburg have their refuse collected at least once a week.*

Whilst you are still occupying the seat of power, please allow me to ask my fellow councillors a few questions. They can respond by lifting their hands if their answer is yes.

They can add an amen if their question touches their soul.

Fellow councillors, all of those who are in favour of a prosperous, democratic, developmental Johannesburg - please raise your hands. All of those who think that Johannesburg is turning and very soon we shall see results, please raise your hands. All of those who think that we are on the right track, please raise your hands. All of those who are in favour of sustainability, please raise your hands. All of those who are in favour of continuity, please raise your hands. All who look forward to the work of the Bomb Squad, please say, Siyabonga!

Madam Speaker, there you have it. I think today is going to be a good day. Recently, we celebrated former President Thabo Mbeki's 83rd birthday, right here at the Joburg Theatre. People were encouraged to give me a hug, when they see me because they understand that our task is heavy and alone, we will not win. A simple, hug will be an indication that we too are here to help. Every hug symbolized a partnership and a willingness to work together.

Councillor Belinda Echeozonjoku, I received lots of hugs. Please record this, so that you do not accuse me of not informing Council. I am happy to give you a hug because I understand the pain of leading an opposition party. You can break the cycle of mental slavery within your party and join us on our journey of re-imagining Johannesburg.

As we look forward to Thabo Mbeki's 84th birthday in 2026, let us not forget that he once said I quote. " I am certain that South Africa will not succeed in its efforts to rebuild, reconstruct and develop herself if she does not inspire all our people black and white, to accept that they share an equal and shared responsibility and opportunity to work together to ensure a happy future for all". We are building the Johannesburg we want to see. This is our task and our commitment. Focus and the will to serve must be the driving force behind every decision we make during this Council sitting. I thank you, Madam Speaker."

7 MOTIONS

MOTION 1:

MOTION OF THE VOTE OF NO CONFIDENCE IN THE EXECUTIVE MAYOR, CLLR SELLO ENOCH 'DADA' MORERO

PROPOSER: Councillor Christians A
SECONDER: Councillor Niemand G

Councillor Christians (DA) requested that the proposer and seconder of the motion be swapped, with himself as the seconder and Councillor Niemand as the proposer to table the motion.

The Speaker stated that, based on legal advice, the rule would normally apply only if either the proposer or the seconder was absent. As both were present, she ruled that the request to swap the proposer and seconder could not be permitted.

Councillor Christians (DA) responded that the rule does not provide as stated by the Speaker; however, since she had made her ruling, the matter would be referred to the Rules Committee. He then tabled the motion as follows:

BACKGROUND

1. The Executive Mayor has failed to ensure he conducts his duties fairly and impartially.
2. The Executive Mayor Dada Morero has failed to conduct himself in a manner that promotes democracy
3. Executive Mayor Dada Morero has become extremely partisan and biased where an atmosphere of mistrust amongst political parties is permeating
4. Executive Mayor Dada Morero had become the African National Congress Mayor instead of being a mayor for all the residents of the City of Johannesburg

WE THEREFORE BELIEVE THAT:

The Executive Mayor has failed to effectively manage a stable government and under his leadership, the City of Johannesburg is degenerating and collapsing.

HAVING SAID THAT, WE HAVE LOST CONFIDENCE IN THE EXECUTIVE MAYOR, CLLR DADA MORERO

AS A RESULT, WE RECOMMEND:

1. That a motion of No confidence be passed by Council against the Executive Mayor, Cllr Dada Morero.
2. That upon the passing of the Motion of no confidence against the Executive Mayor, Cllr Dada Morero, an election of the Executive Mayor be done in accordance with Section 55 of the Local Government: Municipal Structures Act 117 of 1998 read with Schedule 3 of the Municipal Structures Act in order to fill the said vacancy, as it is necessary.

The Speaker posed a question to the House, and as there was no clear response, she allowed the debate to proceed. Following deliberations, the Speaker put the motion to a vote, and the results were as follows:

FOR: 75

AGAINST: 144

ABSTENTION: 43

MOTION PUT, BUT NOT CARRIED

MOTION 2:**MOTION ON THE VOTE OF NO CONFIDENCE AGAINST THE WHIP OF COUNCIL,
COUNCILLOR SITHEMBISO ZUNGU**

PROPOSER: Councillor Sifumba N

SECONDER: Councillor Crichton M

Councillor Sifumba (DA) tabled the motion as follows:

I, Nonhlanhla Sifumba, hereby table a notice of motion in terms of in terms of Chapter 7 and Rules 89 and 94 (1) of the Standing Rules and Orders of Council, the proposer and seconder hereby submit the following motion.

Believing that:

This Council has lost all confidence in the Whip of Council in the City of Johannesburg and that a motion of no confidence against the Whip of Council, Councillor Sithembiso Zungu be passed by Council.

BACKGROUND:

The Whip of Council has failed to effectively manage the relationship between political parties represented in Council. Under his whippyery the relationship between political parties in Council has become extremely partisan, biased and dysfunctional where an atmosphere of mistrust is permeating.

Councillor Zungu has failed to provide leadership in facilitating consensus amongst the various political parties represented in Council.

IT IS THEREFORE RECOMMENDED:

- 1 That a motion of a vote of no confidence against the Whip of Council, Councillor Sithembiso Zungu be passed by Council.
- 2 That upon the passing of this motion, the vacancy for the position of the Whip of Council be filled in accordance with the applicable legislation.

The Speaker posed a question to the House, and as there was no clear response, she allowed the debate to proceed. Following deliberations, the Speaker put the motion to a vote, and the results were as follows:

*FOR: 69**AGAINST: 179**ABSTENTION: 6***MOTION PUT, BUT NOT CARRIED**

MOTION 3:

The Speaker announced that the following motion was directed against her in her capacity as Speaker of Council. She invoked Rule 19(1) of the Standing Rules and Orders of Council, which provides that: "If the Speaker is absent or not available to undertake her/his duties or needs to be relieved during a meeting, the Chairperson of Committees shall be the Acting Speaker." She accordingly requested the Chairperson of Committees, Councillor Marema, to preside over the proceedings of Council.

MOTION OF A VOTE OF NO CONFIDENCE AGAINST THE SPEAKER OF COUNCIL, CLLR NOBUHLE MTHEMBU

PROPOSER: Councillor Gwamanda K

SECONDER: Councillor Amad T

Councillor Gwamanda (Aljama-ah) addressed Council and tabled the motion as follows:

KINDLY TAKE NOTICE THAT, in terms of Chapter 7 and particular Rules 89 and 94 (1) of the Standing Rules and Orders of Council, the proposer and seconder hereby submit the following motion.

BELIEVING THAT:

- Since assuming office as Speaker, Cllr Nobuhle Mthembu has failed to exercise neutrality in presiding over the affairs of the Council.
- Under her tenure, the Council has degenerated into a disorderly and dysfunctional institution.
- The Speaker's inability to maintain order and enforce the rules of debate has resulted in an unstable and disruptive Council.
- Instead of fostering a spirit of cooperation and collaboration among the diverse political parties represented in the Council, Cllr Mthembu has contributed to divisions and heightened political tensions.

IT IS THEREFORE RECOMMENDED:

1. That a motion of a vote of no confidence against the Speaker of Council, Councillor Nobuhle Mthembu, be passed by Council.
2. That upon passing of a motion of no confidence against the Speaker of Council, Councillor Nobuhle Mthembu, an election of the Speaker of Council be done in accordance with Section 36 of Local Government Municipal Structures Act 117 of 1998 read with Schedule 3 of the Municipal Structures Act in order to fill the said vacancy.

The Chair of Chairs posed a question to the House, and as there was no clear response, she allowed the debate to proceed. Following deliberations, the Speaker put the motion to a vote, and the results were as follows:

FOR: 212

AGAINST: 48
ABSTENTION: 0


