1 OPENING

The Speaker requested the Council to observe a moment of silence for prayer and meditation.

In his opening remarks, the Secretary to Council apologised for the delay in the commencement of the meeting. He stated that while the notice indicated a start time of 10:30, the meeting was commencing at 11:14 due to the 6th Special Council meeting taking longer than anticipated.

The Speaker welcomed the Executive Mayor of the City of Johannesburg, Councillor S. Morero; the Whip of Council, Councillor N. Zungu; the Chair of Chairs, Councillor V. Marema; all political party leaders and whips; Members of the Mayoral Committee; Chairpersons of the Section 79 Committees; fellow Councillors; the Acting City Manager, Mr. T. Makola; the Secretary to Council, Mr. A. Gobinca; officials of the City of Johannesburg; residents of the City of Johannesburg; members of the media; and all attendees to the 28th Ordinary Council meeting of the City of Johannesburg Municipality.

She thereafter addressed Council as follows:

"Fellow Councillors, it has been brought to my attention that many of our Councillors may not be aware of the process to follow should they find themselves in circumstances that may compromise their safety or put their lives in danger. While the process to review the Councillor Safety Policy is still ongoing, the Legislature has established a procedure that must be followed in such situations.

Should any Councillor face a threat or danger, they should immediately contact the Protocol and Ceremonial Services Unit. This unit, in liaison with the Councillor Affairs Unit, will initiate the necessary steps for the required intervention at that time.

We are all familiar with the details of the Protocol team, and I trust this information will be of great assistance to all Councillors, particularly the whips of the various caucuses represented here. If any Councillor in your caucus is in danger, please reach out to the Speaker's Office.

Furthermore, I would like to bring to the attention of all Councillors that they are required to sign a pledge that serves as a guideline for the performance of their duties in the municipality. This pledge is administered by the Integrity Commissioner.

To ensure a smooth process for signing the pledges, the Integrity Commissioner will visit the various Section 79 Committee sittings to administer the pledge. This will be done in collaboration with the Office of the Chair of Chairs, Councillor Marema, and the respective Section 79 Chairpersons. We request your cooperation in this regard.

Lastly, Councillors, please be informed that measures are being implemented to protect and enhance security within the Council precinct, particularly in the Council Chambers. These efforts aim to strengthen security and create a safe and conducive working environment for all. We appreciate your patience and understanding should any inconvenience arise during this process."

The Speaker informed the Council that a request had been made to elevate reports from the Executive and the Legislature, and she had acceded to the request. The Executive reports were elevated in the following order: Items 60, 56, 56A, 56B, 56C, 58, 59, 57, and 55. The Legislature elevated Item 61 and all three motions.

She further announced that her office had been made aware of a water outage in the Council precinct. The Protocol and Councillor Affairs Department was liaising with Joburg Water, which was not initially aware of the disruption but was working to resolve the issue.

Regarding the signing of the pledge, Councillor Christians (DA) inquired whether it was the same pledge that Councillors had previously signed or if it was an addendum to the existing pledge.

In her response, the Speaker clarified that the pledge was not the same as the initial pledge. She added that the Chairpersons of the committees would communicate the details of the arrangements made with the Integrity Commissioner.

Councillor Niemand (DA) put it on record that he had serious concerns about signing the pledge with the Integrity Commissioner. He stated that the function did not fall within her terms of reference, which were clear, and he wanted this noted. He further mentioned that the issue had not been raised in the Ethics Committee, which was the committee empowered to assign such functions to the Integrity Commissioner.

The Speaker allowed 10 minutes for Legal to verify the number of Councillors present and confirm quorum. Legal confirmed that there were 211 Councillors present, and therefore, the meeting could proceed as there was a quorum. She further notified Councillors that a body count would be conducted when Council considers the Adjustment Budget to ensure the numbers balance.

3.1 Statement by the Executive Mayor

The Executive Mayor addressed Council as follows:

“Greetings to Madam Speaker, Councillor Nobuhle Mthembu. Greetings to our Whip of Council, in absentia, Councillor Sithembiso Zungu. Greetings to the Chair of Chair, Councillor Marema. Greetings to all whips of political parties, fellow Councilors. Greetings to the Executive Team, we hope you will continue with the work that you are doing in terms of bylaw enforcement in the inner city, and generally in Johannesburg. To the residents of Johannesburg.

Madam Speaker,

It is only 7 months since we took the hot seats and indeed these are hot seats. As we continue to sit on these hot seats, we must reflect on why we are here, what we are doing and how are we changing lives? Recently, my mind is preoccupied with the number 5.8. What does this number mean to us? 5.8 million is the total number of residents living in the City of Johannesburg. This is number counted by Stats SA. If we take a step back for a second, and reimagine this number differently, could it be our lucky number? What would it mean for a city like Johannesburg?

Roughly 5.21 million people in Johannesburg live in formal dwellings. Roughly 5.7 million people in Johannesburg have access to water. Roughly 5.46 million people in

Johannesburg have access to electricity. Roughly 5.4 million people in Johannesburg have access to sanitation services. Roughly 5.25 million people in Johannesburg have access to waste removal services. We are so close to hitting the 5.8 mark, and this should be celebrated. Too close yet too far because no residents in Johannesburg should be left behind. This is what should keep us awake at night.

5.8 must be our lucky number. There was a time in the city where we set an ambitious goal to grow the economy by 5%. If we reimagine Johannesburg, we can grow this economy and increase our national GDP contribution to above 16%. The law defines me as the first citizen. Therefore, how do I fit into the 5.8 million? Well, section 56 of the Structures Act says I must:

- 1. Identify the needs of the municipality.*
- 2. Review and evaluate those needs in order of priority.*
- 3. Recommend to the municipal council strategies, programmes and services to address priority needs through the integrated development plan, and the estimates of revenue and expenditure, taking into account any applicable national and provincial development plans.*
- 4. Recommend or determine the best way, including partnership and other approaches, to deliver those strategies, programmes and services.*
- 5. Identify and develop criteria in terms of which progress in the implementation of the strategies, programmes and services referred to in subsection (2) (c) can be evaluated, including key performance indicators which are specific to the municipality and common to local government in general.*
- 6. Evaluate progress against the key performance indicators.*
- 7. Review the performance of the municipality in order to improve the economy, efficiency and effectiveness of the municipality; the efficiency of credit control and revenue and debt collection services; and the implementation of the municipality's by-laws.*
- 8. Monitor the management of the municipality's administration in accordance with the directions of the municipal council.*
- 9. Oversee the provision of services to communities in the municipality in a sustainable manner.*
- 10. Perform such duties and exercise such powers as the council may delegate to the executive mayor in terms of section 59 of the Local Government: Municipal Systems Act, 2000 (Act 32 of 2000).*
- 11. Annually report on the involvement of communities and community organisations in the affairs of the municipality.*
- 12. Ensure that regard is given to public views and report on the effect of consultation on the decisions of the council.*

Fellow Councillors

I do not perform these tasks alone. I am supported by a capable Mayoral Committee and a professional executive management team. Today's council meeting is about how you hold us accountable. It is also the council meeting that enables us to collectively reflect and reimagine our pathway in order to make a difference in the lives of the 5.8 million residents we serve.

The Auditor-General reminds us that we are a growing city. Therefore, we must be mindful that we need to put in place infrastructure that responds to our growing population. Furthermore, she draws our attention to our non-technical losses which are due to theft and bypassing of the meters, illegal recalibration of meters, damaged meters, faulty voltage and current transformers, billing errors and customers without meters. This challenge is hampering our growth.

Today as we make critical decisions such as stabilizing our governance, we must ensure that we improve our relationship with the 5.8 million residents, who live, work and play in the City of the Johannesburg. All of us have experienced water, electricity, roads and waste management challenges. These challenges are hampering our relationship with our communities.

Every day is a service delivery battlefield, but this battle we are going to win. Because it is us who declared this City a World Class African City and it is us who can make it a World Class African City of the future.

Every day we are on the ground, fixing our infrastructure and ensure that by-law enforcement takes place. Every Councillor in this council chamber must find themselves on the ground, talking to the same residents who elected them and telling them "let's work together to make our city great".

Recently I reported that Johannesburg Water has been observing and monitoring significant progress on the overall recovery of water systems that was impacted by recent past events, which included power failures that affected pumping capacity to many Johannesburg Water reservoirs and towers. These incidents led to further impact and reduction of our systems, where reservoirs and towers were critically low and, in some instances, empty and reduced rate of recovery. Technical interventions by both Rand Water and Johannesburg Water technical teams are working hard to contribute efforts to progressively realize recovery and to improve the affected reservoirs and towers in order to boost supply and sustain capacity.

If you are listening, please call us and tell us how we can help you. As we help you, please tell us how you can also help the City of Johannesburg.

Our strategic priorities as set out in our Integrated Development Plan remain. For the remaining months we are channeling energy to:

- 1. Ensuring our financial sustainability pathway remains the cornerstone for operational success.*
- 2. Accelerate service delivery reforms to improve citizen satisfaction.*
- 3. Enhance our safety measures through data-driven and resource-optimized strategies.*

As the executive leadership of the city, we put in place an integrated service delivery war room, whose primary objective is to improve the coordination and effectiveness of service delivery across Johannesburg's regions through an integrated operational approach. Already we are starting to see:

1. *Real-Time Monitoring*
2. *Rapid Response Activation*
3. *Cross-Entity Coordination*
4. *Strategic Oversight*
5. *Data-Driven Decision-Making*
6. *Performance Management*
7. *Citizen-Centric Service Delivery*

Furthermore, we have reached out to all sectors to help us to reimagine the City of Johannesburg. From Government we reached out to the President of the Republic of South Africa, His Excellency, President Ramaphosa. I am pleased to inform Council that he responded positively to my letter and next week he will be visiting the City so that we can work together and change the City of Johannesburg, street by street and until we get it right.

The private sector has responded positively, and I want to thank leaders of the banking, property and taxi sectors for raising the hands and voices in a quest to rebuild the City of Johannesburg.

Jozi my Jozi has pledged their support and commitment towards the city and already substantial progress is being made. Unsafe spaces are going to be safe. Dirty places are now getting clean. By activating the creative industry, we are now reimagining Johannesburg into a place where 5.8 million people will live in peace.

As we perform our duties today, we must be mindful, G20 and U20 are here. Ke nako. This is the first for Africa. Allow me to remind you, we are a city of firsts. We must show the world what solidarity, equality and sustainable development means. As the host City for G20 and U20 the shoulders of Africa rest on us. Our G20 Presidency, supported by U20 events, presents us with an opportunity to showcase our city. Most importantly to create jobs in the City of Johannesburg. All of us must play our part.

In conclusion Madam Speaker,

We must not be afraid to perform our duties. 5.8 is a large number. As public representatives of 5.8 million people, we must keep them in thought before we speak. We must protect them from all that hampers their growth. This is our city, and we cannot be bullied by those who destroy our infrastructure. We cannot be bullied by those who refuse to follow the laws of the city. We cannot be bullied by those who have outsourced the responsibilities as outline in our Bill of Right.

This is all we have, so let us make it work together!"
