Item 5 COJ DEBT-RELIEF PROGRAMME PHASE
FOUR (4) - TO ASSIST QUALIFYING
CUSTOMERS WITH RELIEF FROM
HISTORICAL DEBT

RESOLVED

That the framework for the COJ Debt Relief Program – Phase Four, as outlined in the report, be approved.

- (1) Applicants must be registered owners of the property,
- (2) Only residential, small business, faith-based organisations, non-profit organisations, Old Age Homes, Orphanages and Body Corporate account holders may apply.
- (3) The market value of the residential property or combined properties owned by the applicant must not exceed R2 500 000 based on the City's Valuation Roll. The municipal valuation cap only applicable to individuals.
- (4) Pensioners & ESP beneficiaries: eligible for a 60 to 100% write-off.
- (5) Residential Customers, all income levels: eligible for a 50% write-off. The remaining 50% debt can be paid through a structured payment plan in line with the city's credit control and debt collection policy (AOD) or settled in full.
- (6) Small businesses, faith-based organisations, NPOs, old age homes, orphanages, body corporates (\leq R3 million annual turnover): eligible for a 50% write-off of the debt above 36 months. The remaining debt can be paid through a structured payment plan in line with the city's credit control and debt collection policy (AOD) or settled in full.
- (7) Interest and Fee Waivers: All categories qualify for a 100% interest write-off, along with waivers for charges like final demand and disconnection notices, and any other sundry charges.
- (8) Large businesses are eligible for a 50% debt write-off for debts older than 36 months. The remaining balance must be paid within 30 days
- (9) The reports will be submitted quarterly to Group Chief Financial Officer, Section 79 Finance Committee, Mayoral Committee and Council for monitoring and evaluation and refinement.
- (10) The Policy review submitted annually to Section 79 Finance Committee, Mayoral Committee and Council for refinement.

RESOLVED

Item 9 OVERSIGHT REPORT OF THE SECTION 79
 ENVIRONMENT AND INFRASTRUCTURE
 SERVICES COMMITTEE'S SITE VISIT
 JOHANNESBURG WATER BRIXTON
 RESERVOIR AND TOWER

Councillor Ntombela (ActionSA) sought clarity on Items 8 and 9 regarding the debates on oversight visit reports, noting that it had been agreed that no speakers would address these Items. Consequently, ActionSA had not submitted any speakers. The Speaker stated that once Councillors' names have been submitted to speak, they cannot be prevented from doing so. She referred the matter to the Whip of Council for guidance.

The Whip of Council stated that oversight visit reports are not subject to debate and expressed surprise that the Item was being debated. He noted that only the DA had expressed an intention to debate the Item, and clarified that Council was only required to indicate agreement or disagreement thereon.

The Speaker responded that if that was the agreement of the Whippery, the Item would be dealt with accordingly.

Councillor Christians (DA) stated that the Whip of Council was challenging the Speaker's ruling. He emphasized that the Speaker had ruled that every Councillor has the right to speak on any report, including oversight visit reports, and that procedural shortcomings by the Whippery cannot override this right. He further clarified that the Items in question were oversight visit reports specifically submitted for consideration at this meeting, and not quarterly reports.

The Speaker noted that Councillor Ntombela had sought clarity regarding the non-debate of oversight visit items and accordingly referred the matter to the Whip of Council. The Whip of Council confirmed that names had been submitted to speak, contrary to the prior agreement that oversight visit reports would not be debated. The Speaker requested that Council uphold the previous agreement, ruled that oversight visit reports would not be discussed in future meetings, and noted that members of the Whippersy agreed with this position.

The Speaker enquired whether the Items were agreed to, and the majority of the House indicated their agreement.

Councillor Christians (DA) requested a two-minute caucus break for the DA.

The Speaker stated that the Item had already been agreed to and was therefore closed. She further clarified that she was not suppressing anyone but was acting in accordance with the agreement of the Whippersy. She confirmed that she had read out the recommendations as listed in the agenda, that the Item had been agreed to, and that it was closed.

- 5 That the That Accounting Officer ensures that an external comprehensive skills audit for all senior managers is conducted. The investigation must commence within 30 days after adoption of the report by council and be completed by 30 June 2026.
- 6 That, where applicable, the Accounting Officer must comply with the requirements of section 32(6) of the MFMA

- 7 That the Accounting Officer submits this report to National Treasury, together with the minutes of the meeting of Council that reflect the Council resolution for this report, within seven working days of its adoption. Group Finance must submit a report with evidence attesting to this submission to the Municipal Public Accounts Committee.

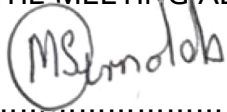
