REFUSE CHARGES

Waste management service tariffs has increase by an average of 6.8% with effect **01 July 2018**. The tariff is step to ensure affordability for lower valued properties.

Domestic tariff increase by 6% for lowest property value and 8% for highest property value categories:

- Refuse charge is levied to residential customers (domestic) based on the value of properties.
- Properties valued at and below R350 000, as well as indigent's households are exempt from this charge.
- Residential Refuse Removal - A standard domestic refuse removal service will comprise the removal of one 240 litre wheelie bin, once per week.
- Refuse charge is billed once monthly.
- The waste management service tariff will be applicable when collecting from households, single erf, or a townhouse unit or flat.
- These service charges is levied to all residential properties base within the jurisdiction of the City of Johannesburg.
